

You can use our soft faux fur to sew lovely poufs, cushions, throws and much more. Learn how to make a pillow case in the instructions “Quick Cosy Cushions” (79638).

Match the fur cushions with pretty pictures of animals or objects from nature. It’s easy to do with our transfer sheets – just print out a design and iron it to cotton fabric.



Big pouf

Materials required

- Approx. 80x155 cm faux fur (grey 691901).
- Approx. 50 litres polystyrene balls (306065) or another filling material, such as old towels, rags or cushions.
- Optional cotton fabric for inner cushion approx. 80x150 cm.

Measure the circumference of the circle (approx. 148 cm with one cm seam allowance). Trace a rectangle onto the faux fur; use the measured circumference of the circle as the long side and a height of 30 cm. You should have a piece that is about 148x30 cm. Do not forget to add a seam allowance. Cut out.

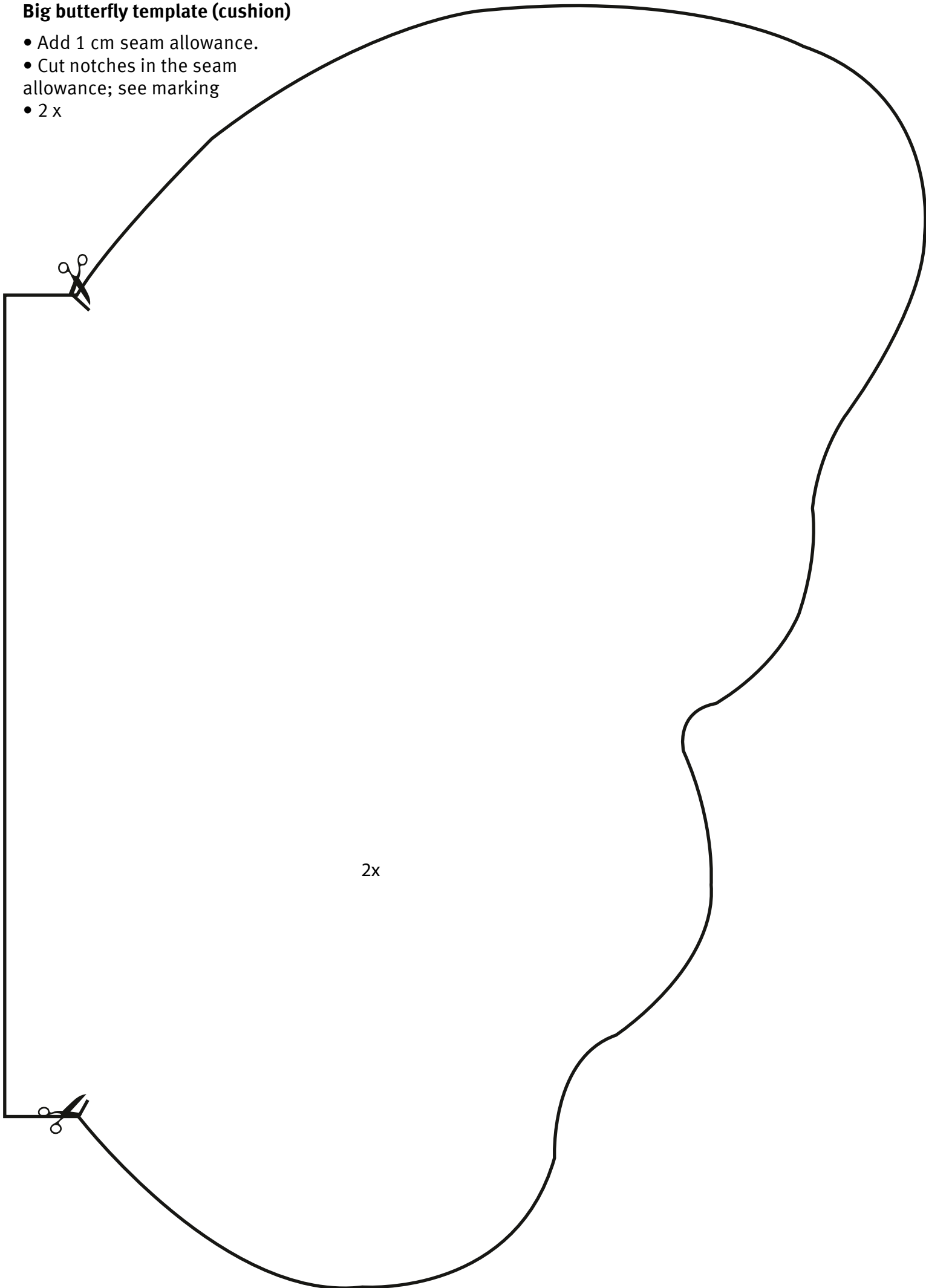
Carefully pin the long side of the rectangle around one circle, right side to right side. Try to match up the fabric stripes. Sew on. Pin the other circle the same way and sew on.

You now have an opening on the side of the pouf. Pin together and sew the opening about 5 cm from the top and bottom. Turn right side out.

If you like, you can sew an inner cushion to prevent the filling from leaking out (polystyrene balls in particular may have a tendency to want to escape through small holes). In that case, sew the inner cushion using the same method as the actual pouf. Poke it into the pouf and fill it. Carefully sew up the opening by hand, and finally, repeat with the fur pouf opening. Use heavy sewing thread. If you do not want to sew an inner cushion, then fill the fur pouf and sew up the opening.

Big butterfly template (cushion)

- Add 1 cm seam allowance.
- Cut notches in the seam allowance; see marking

Small butterfly template, (garland)

- Place the template on the felt and trace with a marker.
- Cut out as many butterflies as you want, depending on the length of the garland.
- Cut a vertical 1 cm opening in the middle of the butterflies so that you can thread a ribbon through it.
