Panduro Wool Beanie

Sizes

Circumferences: 50-55 cm = S
(55-59 cm = M) 59-62 cm = L

Yarn

2 x Panduro Wool 320167 natural white, 50 g.

For a fluffy knit,

add a strand of 50 Mohair Shades from Katia.

Gauge

19 stitches x 25 rounds on 4 mm knitting needles = 10x10 cm.

Knitting needles

40 cm circular knitting needles and double pointed needles, 4 mm – or to obtain required gauge.

Loosely cast on 96 (104) 112 st on the circular needles and work stocking stitch in the round until your work measures 20 (22) 23 cm.

Now fold in the base of the tube you have now knitted so your work is double thickness and the cast-on edge reaches up to the needles on the inside. Keep the right side (RS) facing you. Pick up the first stitch from the cast-on edge (starting where the cast-on tail is still dangling) with your left-hand needle and knit this stitch knitwise together with the first stitch on this next round of live stitches. Continue picking up one stitch from the cast-on edge for each live stitch and knit them as one for the entire round until the whole of the cast-on edge has been knitted into your work.

Now work another 3 cm stocking stitch in the round.

Turn your work and continue in stocking stitch in the opposite direction. These stocking stitches are on what was the wrong side and will show as textured garter stitches on what was the right side of the knitting (the outside of the beanie will be smooth stocking stitch). Continue in stocking stitch until your work measures 9 (10) 11 cm from where the cast-on edge was secured.

Decreases:

Divide the round up into four equal parts, placing a stitch marker at 24 (26) 28 st intervals. Switch to double-pointed needles as you decrease more stitches and the piece becomes too small to work smoothly on the circular needles.

Decrease as follows on alternate rounds until you have decreased 8 (9) 10 times.

Work every alternate round in stocking stitch.

HOW TO WORK DECREASES on decrease-rounds:

Work *K1, K2tog, K to 2 st before the next marker, slip 1 st, K1, pass the slipped st over the st you just knitted*. Repeat four times to the end of the round, decreasing a total of 8 st on a decrease round.

After these 16 (18) 20 rounds, you should have 32 (40) 48 stitches, which you then decrease on every round until only 16 stitches remain. On the last round, K2tog all the way around. Draw the yarn through the remaining 8 stitches, tug to cinch the top of the beanie and secure the yarn ends. Fold up the wide edge and your beanie is complete.
