

Party atmosphere with tulle balls!

Tulle balls in a variety of colours and sizes are a quick way to spice up a boring room! Or why not use them as party decorations?

Materials required

For a small ball (15–20 cm): 3 strips, 130 cm For a large ball (25–35 cm): 4 strips, 130 cm 1 m thick sewing thread per boll Ribbon for hanging, such as pink organza ribbon (025228) or satin ribbon (302822)

Cut the strips to the width you want the diameter of the ball to be. We varied the diameter between 15 and 35 cm.

- 1. Cut the tulle widthwise. (Our tulle is about 130 cm wide).
- 2. Thread approx. 1 metre of thick sewing thread through a needle with a blunt tip. Tie a thick knot in the end.

Tip! It may help to tie on a small bead or something similar to prevent the knot from pulling through the tulle.

- 3. Sew up and down the middle of the tulle strip, with about 2 cm between each stitch. Tighten gradually. Continue with the next strip. Tighten the tulle, fluff it a bit and shape the ball as you go. Sew all the strips together.
- 4. When you think the ball is full enough, pull the tulle pieces together thoroughly in the middle and tie a double knot as tightly as possible.

Measure out how long you want the ribbon hanger for the ball to be. Sew one end of the ribbon to the knot in the middle of the ball. Cut off the sewing thread once it is attached to the ribbon.
