A fun way to make your favourite old jeans trendy and unique is to give them colour! Here, we'll show you a few simple techniques and tips for what you can do. Remember to protect the clothes you are wearing and the area around your workplace, particularly when using the spattering technique. Spatter painting is best done outdoors. Remember to wash and iron jeans before painting them. Our Palett fabric paint is available for light fabrics (thinner consistency) and dark fabrics (thicker consistency). Test the spatter technique on a sheet of paper or fabric piece first to see the effects. Fabric paint with glitter is applied with a brush and creates fabulous results! Place a protective layer inside the jeans to prevent the paint from seeping through to the back.

**Important!** Once the fabric paint is dry, fix it for 5 minutes from the wrong side with an iron set to cotton (or on the front with an ironing cloth between the iron and the garment). After 24 hours, the paint can be washed at 40°C. **Fabric pens:** Do not require fixing. Can be washed at 40°C after 12 hours.
