 INSTRUCTIONS



You need:

1 leather strap 2x100 cm (305250)
8 hollow rivets Ø 9 mm for thickness 4–6 mm (982490)
1 leather label 4x7 cm (305252)
Gütermann HT2 textile glue (985500)
42x100 cm cotton twill natural (304697)
Palett fabric paint gold (241133)
Palett fabric paint pastel green (251155)
Foam rubber roller (920941)
Masking tape (667859)

Tools:

Hammer (700053)
Scissors or craft knife (such as 512811)
Palette (such as 244939)
Letter punch set A–Z (700050)

Fabric bag with leather strap and stylish wall storage for magazines.

It's always smart to have an attractive fabric bag, which is both convenient and environmentally friendly. Leather details add an extra touch of style. Trendy leather strap can be used in interior decor, for example to make stylish wall storage for your magazines.

Fabric bag with leather strap

Method: 1 cm seam allowance is included in the fabric measurements.

Remember to wash the fabric before you begin.

Zigzag the edges of the piece of fabric and then arrange it doubled over, right side facing right side, and sew along the long sides. Iron the seams apart.

Fold the top edge of the bag down by about 5 cm and sew a seam about 4 cm from the upper edge.

Paint with fabric paint:

Be careful to protect your work surface and clothing when you paint.

Turn the bag right side out and apply masking tape to form a border around the lighter painted section of the bag. Ensure the tape meets at the edges from both the front and back sides.

Pour some paint onto a palette and roll on a thin coat until you have covered the surface of one side of the bag. Let dry for a while before you turn it over and paint the back. Then let dry for at least one hour.

Remove the tape and apply masking tape to a new area, creating a border for the next painted section (feel free to let the darker shade overlap the lighter shade by a few millimetres). Roll/paint using the same method as before. Remove the tape and let dry. Fix the paint from the back for 3–5 minutes with an iron set to cotton.

When the bag is inside out, fold the bottom corners crosswise and sew an 8 cm seam straight across each corner, to give the bag a base. Cut off the excess fabric along the seams.

Turn the bag right side out again.

Cut two 42 cm pieces and four 4 cm pieces of leather strap.

Using the tool included with the hollow rivets, make two holes at the ends of the long straps with about 2 cm between them.

Make two holes in all of the shorter straps as well, also with 2 cm in between, and in the bag where you want to attach the straps.

Place a short leather strap on

the inside of the bag and a long one on the front. Punch the rivets through the leather strap/bag fabric/leather strap. Attach the other end of the handle the same way, and also the other handle on the opposite side.

Use the letter punches to emboss your name or another text on the leather label and attach it to the bag with the textile glue.

Magazine hanger

You need:

1 leather strap 2x100 cm (305250)
3 hollow rivets Ø 9 mm for thickness 4–6 mm (982490)
1 wooden ring 60 mm (300062)

Method:

Cut the leather strap according to the dimensions in image 1 and make holes according to the marks.

Assemble the pieces with hollow rivets according to images 2–4.
