



BEADED JEWELLERY

- ① **BEADING LOOM BRACELET:** Weave a beautiful bracelet in pastels. See our instructions in the “DIY Free Bead Weaving” leaflet, item no. 600092, or in our video, which shows how to use a beading loom.
- ② **PASTEL BRACELET:** Thread beads onto an elastic thread and tie together. Combine them any way you like; feel free to take inspiration from our picture.
- ③ **WHITE BRACELET & NECKLACE:** We used glass beads with a matt surface. Thread beads onto jewellery wire in the order shown in the picture or however you like; beads in varying sizes look lovely together. You get to determine whether you want the necklace to rest higher or lower on the neck by using X number of beads. When you are satisfied, attach a clasp to one end and a jump ring to the other.
- ④ **FRESHWATER PEARL NECKLACE:** String a fun necklace with beads that are “clumped” together. Fold an approx. 80 cm long piece of fishing line in half and make a loop in the centre. Thread on 2 or 3 beads from either end and tie a secure knot. Thread a few more beads from either end and tie again; repeat until the beads “clump together” and you are pleased with the length of the clump. Tie the final knot as a loop and attach a chain (of the length you want your necklace to be) to both ends.
- ⑤ **BEADING LOOM NECKLACE:** Combine colours however you like; thread the beads on a little randomly for an attractive palette. No pattern is needed here.
- ⑥ **LONG NECKLACE WITH FEATHER:** Paint the feather with porcelain paint (follow the instructions for the paint). Cut 2 x 80 cm pieces of jewellery wire. Thread one piece of wire through the hole in the feather, then fold the wire in half. Next, thread beads onto the folded wire until you achieve the desired (half) length. Next, thread the other piece of wire through the hole in the feather, fold the wire in half, and thread on beads using the same method. Gather up the ends and secure them with a crimp bead; squeeze the bead together with a pair of flat-nosed pliers.
