

## A knitted cosy for flower pots

Covering pots with a knitted liner gives the window sill a relaxed and cosy look. Adjust the size of your knitting to your pot.

## **Abbreviations:**

K = knit stitch

P = purl stitch

Row 1: knit entire row

Row 2: Knit 6, purl 2, K6, P2; continue for the entire row

Row 3: K2, P6, K2, P6; continue for the entire row

Row 4: K6, P2, K6, P2; continue for the entire row

Row 5: K2, P6, K2, P6; continue for the entire row

Row 6: lift 3 stitches onto an extra needle and hold them in front of the work while knitting the next 3 stitches, then knit the 3 stitches on the extra needle;

purl the next 2 stitches and continue for the rest of the row

Row 7: K2, P6, K2, P6; continue for the entire row

Repeat rows 2-7 until the work has reached the desired length.

Finish with a row of knit stitches and then cast off with knit stitches. Sew the cosy together along two sides to make a tube.

## You need:

Needles 8 mm (981673) Samo yarn in light pink, 50 g (323944) Birch sock needles, 6 mm (982661), or some other kind of stitch holder to lift the stitches in row 6
